## I N T R O D U C T I O N

This guide describes and indexes the Smolensk regional records of the All-Union Communist Party (Vsesoiuznaia Kommunisticheskaia Partia) of the Soviet Union, covering the period 1917 to 1941. It consists of three parts: a subject index to the Smolensk records; a register describing each record item in microfilm sequence; and an index to the register containing provenance, name, geographic, and subject entries.

The Smolensk Archive reached the United States as war booty, after the records seized in 1941 by German military forces in Russia fell into the hands of the U.S. Army in the course of military operations in Germany in 1945. The original records are in the custody of the National Archives and Records Service (NARS), except the seven files of T84 that were inadvertently returned to Germany with other German records.

The microfilming was done in Alexandria, Va., by the Department of the Army, Office of the Adjutant General, Departmental Records Branch (TAGO), and the American Committee for the Study of War Documents of the American Historical Association (AHA) in cooperation with NARS. With the termination of AHA participation in July 1963, NARS assumed responsibility for preparation of guides to captured records microfilmed at Alexandria.

The master negatives to the Smolensk Archive consist of three microfilm publications: T87 has 530 files (identified by the prefix WKP 1 through 527, and 539 through 541), reproduced on rolls 2 through 69; roll 1 of T87 contains both the brief card descriptions of WKP 1 through 538 of T87, T84, and T88 by Michael Halyshyn and the more detailed unedited card descriptions of WKP 1 through 494 of T87 and a selective index by Merle Fainsod, from which most of the textual material of the register was derived as described below. T84 has 7 files (identified by WKP 528 through 534, formerly EAP 116/154e,f,g,h, and EAP 116/155, 116/156, and 116/171), reproduced on rolls 27 and 28; and T88 has 4 files (identified by WKP 535 through 538, formerly RS 921 through 924), reproduced on rolls 1 through 4. These negatives have been deposited with the Publications Sales Branch (NEPS), National Archives and Records Service, Washington, DC 20408, from which copies of specific rolls may be purchased. Reference copies may be consulted in the microfilm reading room at the National Archives Building.

The only work to date that has exploited the Smolensk Archive for information about Soviet life and institutions during the 1920's and 1930's is Merle Fainsod's Smolensk Under Soviet Rule, published by Harvard University Press in 1958. Since then, only a few books have made even passing reference to the Smolensk Archive. Scholars may have decided that Fainsod's book exhausted the research potential of the archive; in fact, the archival files still have much to teach us about life in the formative years of the Soviet regime and about the problems confronting the state and population. Possibly the regional character of the files, covering an administrative territory restricted to the western region of the Russian Republic, has

caused specialists in Soviet affairs to conclude that its material is too limited in scope. Yet studies in local history of Western countries indicate clearly that research in the history of a particular region is a highly rewarding approach to the study of complex social and political developments. It is also likely that research involving use of the archival documents has been discouraged by the dearth of adequate available guides. The combined subject index and synopses of files presented in the following pages is intended to remove this obstacle.

Fainsod was the first to prepare an annotated subject index to the archive. His index is included with the first roll of T87 and is organized according to the subject headings of the chapters in his book. In the introduction to Smolensk Under Soviet Rule, Fainsod declared that he was primarily interested in archival material on Soviet political processes, which he believed were shaped by totalitarian methods of rule. The index reflects these particular interests and preconceptions. It covers 24 subjects, ranging from "party and government at the oblast level" to "anti-Semitism and the Jewish problem." It includes no categories related to social structure or processes and treats economic issues in a tangential manner. Yet these topics represent rewarding areas for research in the Smolensk Archive. Another weakness of Fainsod's index arises from the fact that it does not identify all the files containing material on a particular subject; for example, significant documents on the development of higher education in the Smolensk area, one of his topics, are far more numerous than his listing indicates. The Fainsod index is a helpful introductory guide, but it provides easy access only to relatively few important documents.

The subject index presented as part I is of a different character. It includes every major subject in the archive and provides complete cross-reference to material on any subject. Such topics as industry, agriculture, and trade provide a survey of the economic organization and development of the region. Social structure is included under class rubrics of worker, peasant, and intelligentsia. This index is not as precise, however, as Fainsod's because it is not annotated and does not provide page references to specific documents within a particular file. Because pagination is sporadic (at times incorrect) and the documents often so complex as to defy any clear system of annotation, descriptive apparatus has been kept to a bare minimum.

The subject index was compiled primarily by Daniel Ipson under the direction of Daniel R. Brower, both of the University of California, Davis. Funds for that project came from research grants from that university and from the Research Development Committee, American Association for the Advancement of Slavic Studies.

The second part of this guide consists of a transcription, slightly edited, of synopses of the contents of individual files. Most of these synopses also appear on note cards at the beginning of each file on the microfilm rolls.

The textual material for the register derives from descriptions by Merle Fainsod, assisted by the RAND Corporation, and by Michael Halysyn of the Departmental Records Branch, TAGO. Joseph Hartgrove, NARS, Diplomatic Branch, described WKP 539 through 541. Harry Hickman, NARS, Editorial Branch, edited copy for the entire guide.

The third part of this guide consists of a computer index to the register containing provenance, geographic, name, and subject entries.

Input for the computer-printed register and the computerized index, Parts II and III, was prepared by Johanna M. Wagner, NARS, Modern Military Branch, who with Alvin Theisen, General Services Administration (GSA), Office of Data Systems, improvised the input scheme, an extension of the SPINDEX program.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE USE OF THE SUBJECT INDEX TO THE  
SMOLENSK ARCHIVE

Most of the files listed in the subject index are reproduced on micro-film publication T87; the few reproduced on T84 or T88 appear at the end of each subject entry.

For the T87 files, the number of the roll precedes the numbers of the relevant files and their dates under each subject. Thus, the indication "7 - 40 (1929)" under the heading "Agriculture" indicates that material on this subject can be found on roll 7, WKP 40, which contains documents from the year 1929; "6 - 120 (1921), 122 (1921)" indicates that on roll 6 files WPK 120 and WPK 122 (both from 1921) contain material on the same subject.

For files reproduced on T84 or T88, the roll number is preceded by the publication number, and, where appropriate, under EAP or RS numbers as well as the WKP number; for example, T88: 1 - (WKP) 535/RS921;  
T84: 28 - 533/EAP 116/156.

## PART II

### INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE USE OF THE REGISTER TO THE SMOLENSK ARCHIVE

Each of the descriptions in this register is preceded by five headers: WKP (abbreviation of German transliteration of the Russian Vsesoiuznaia Kommunisticheskaia Partia) document number, MCNO (Microfilm Copy Number), Roll number, Item number (number of the original WKP item to indicate the sequence of filming on rolls without frame numbers), and Date (date span of the document).

The following descriptions of those files reproduced on rolls 2 through 52 and 69 in NARS Microfilm Publication T87 also appear on the first microfilm frame (without frame numbers) of each file. The descriptions of the contents of the remaining files come from synopses on these files found on roll 1 of T87. Rolls 53 through 68 of T87, rolls 27 and 28 of T84, and rolls 1 through 4 of T88 were often filmed without the descriptive text at the beginning of the pertinent document. The order in which the files are described in this guide follows the sequence on the microfilm rolls, so the file numbers are not always consecutive. The original descriptions have been further edited for clarity. For the spelling of geographical areas, the Columbia Lippincott Gazetteer of the World, 1970, and the NIS (National Intelligence Survey) Gazetteer (Office of Geography, Department of the Interior, Washington, 1955-64) were used; the various spellings of geographical areas found in the descriptions are given in parentheses. The span dates, derived directly from the documents, sometimes vary from those given in the manual subject index.

A computer-printed index to this register begins on page 191. It contains provenance, geographic, name, and subject-matter entries with subheads, and provides page and cross-references to the pertinent document descriptions listed in this guide. The computer input for the computer-printed register and index was prepared by Johanna M. Wagner, NARS, Military Archives Division, Modern Military Branch.

### PART III

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE USE OF THE INDEX TO THE REGISTER OF THE SMOLENSK ARCHIVE

This index consists of entries derived from the descriptive matter of the register constituting Part II, rather than directly from the record items as was the manual subject-matter index constituting Part I. This index was computer formatted and printed from simultaneous input of keywords and individual record items description in the register; this index was supplemented with cross-references.

Keywords include names of individuals, geographical terms, and Communist Party organizations, functions, activities, and government operations of the Smolensk Oblast with alphabetical subhead terms, including chronological sort and page number references to the pertinent document listed in the register. Also included are WKP document numbers with cross-references to their former EAP and RS numbers. A reasonable effort was made to ascertain correct spelling of geographical areas using the Columbia Lippincott Gazetteer of the World, 1970, and the NIS (National Intelligence Survey) Gazetteer (Office of Geography, Department of the Interior, Washington, 1955-64). Span dates for the entire document are given in the sequence of year, month, and day; 00-fillers were used when the specific month and day could not be determined.

Microfilm copies of one or more rolls of microfilm may be purchased at the current price (January 1980) of \$13 a roll. Prices are subject to change without advanced public notice. This price includes postage or shipping costs on orders sent by surface mail within the United States or to Mexico or Canada and on small orders sent to other countries. Additional costs for airmail shipment will be quoted on request. Orders of 40 rolls or more sent to foreign countries other than Canada or Mexico are subject to an added 5 percent shipping charge.

Checks or money orders for microfilm should accompany the order. They should be made payable to the General Services Administration (NEPS) and should be mailed to the Cashier, NARS, GSA, Washington, DC 20408. The order should specify Microfilm Publication(s), T87, T84, T88, the roll number or numbers, and the price.

Persons ordering microfilm from outside the United States or its possessions should make their remittance by international money order or check drawn in United States dollars on a bank in the United States made payable to the General Services Administration (NEPS) and mailed to the Cashier, NARS, GSA, Washington, DC 20408.
